The half-hour compilation of these interviews, <i>Diaspora in Dialogue: A Profile of Africans in DC</i> will be featured at MOAA’s Black History Month event.</li><li>MOAA/COAA Performance Oversight Hearing with the Committee on Housing and Community Development will be held on February 10th, 2016 at 10am.</li><li>EKO African Diaspora Coding Academy’s 2<sup>nd</sup> session with 42 participants has started.</li><li>FY16 Grant Awardees were selected, a total of 9 community-based organizations were awarded grants.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Commissioner Geremaw initiated a discussion in regard to inclusiveness about Commissioners being involved in the process. Both the idea of transparency and checks and balances was entertained. Suggestions were made for smaller agencies to collaborate with larger agencies to take maximum advantage of funding opportunities.</li></ul></li><li>Reconfirmation on pending Commissioners seats will take place within 45 days.</li><li>Shared that community-based organizations need support to build capacity and write competitive grant proposals. In the future, we should look for ways that they can be connected to resources that build their capacity, such as mentoring between grantees and future applicants, workshops and training opportunities for community-based organization leaders.</li><li>Emphasized the importance of focusing on the upcoming Performance Hearing.
